

16-19 Tuition Fund Statement 2020-21 As required by the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), we are publishing this statement explaining how we will use the 16-19 tuition fund allocated to the College.

What is the 16-19 Tuition Fund?

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is a one-off funding allocation for the 2020-21 academic year only. It is being provided to support small group tuition for students in GCSE English, maths, and A level/vocational courses where learning has been disrupted. We are only permitted to use this money to support students who did not achieve grade 5 or above in GCSE English or maths

How is the College using this Fund?

- The College has appointed Student Mentors across the curriculum who are offering additional tuition on a one-to-one basis and for small groups of three or less
- They have specifically targeted students who:
 - a) did not achieve grade 5 or above in GCSE English or maths
 - a) have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and would benefit from catch-up support.
- The Study Support team is reviewing the support already provided to eligible students with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). Where it is deemed helpful, additional sessions will be provided to support them
- Eligible students who are struggling with A level or vocational subjects are being identified and offered additional support from subject teachers at the College
- The additional support sessions will be delivered face to face or online using Google Meet, in groups of three or less.
